Sealed proposals will be received by the Director of the Nevada Department of Transportation, Las Vegas Headquarters, located at 123 East Washington Avenue, Las Vegas, NV 89101, until and opened at **1:30 p.m.**, local time on **October 22, 2009**, for Contract No. **3390**, Project Nos. DE-0564(004) and STP-0564(005), SR 564, Lake Mead Parkway, from Boulder Highway (SR 582) to the Lake Mead National Recreation Area and on SR 564, Lake Mead Parkway, from Boulder Highway (SR 582) to Ash Street, Clark County.

SPECIFIC DESCRIPTION OF WORK COVERED BY THIS CONTRACT CONSISTS OF: **WIDENING EXISTING ROADWAY FROM 4 LANES TO 6 LANES AND CONSTRUCT A SHARED USE PATH WITH LIGHTING AND LANDSCAPING.**

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LIGHTS ON IN ELY

The lights are on after recent completion of an NDOT project to install a new stoplight in Ely.

The signal was placed where the US 6 bypass intersects US 6, US 50 and US 93 and funnels into the heart of Ely. The well-traveled route, also known as Great Basin Boulevard, receives the majority of traffic coming into and leaving town; approximately 8,000 vehicles daily. Commercial trucks traveling through northeastern Nevada often cross the intersection, while fast food establishments, gasoline stations, a US Post Office and nearby school generate local traffic.

The intersection improvements began in 2002 with installation of conduit and streetlights. The recent project completed the installation with a signal controller, cabinet, heads and mast arms, pedestrian signal poles, traffic loop detectors and emergency preemption system allowing emergency vehicles to more safely travel through the intersection when responding to emergencies. The intersection itself was also improved with upgraded Americans with Disabilities Act-accessible ramps, enhanced and additional crosswalks and new sidewalk at the southeast corner.

The project was initially requested by the City of Ely through NDOT's project submittal program which invites government agencies and non-profits to submit applications for road improvements on functionally-classified public roads.

"Responding to the City of Ely's request, the Department dedicated money because the project is such an important improvement for the area," explained Kathie Weaver, NDOT assistant district engineer and resident engineer for the project.

The approximately \$200,000 project, built by contractor PAR Electrical Contractors, is a cooperative agreement between NDOT and the City of Ely. The Department has executed right-of-way acquisition, oversaw construction and funded the project up to \$300,000, while the City of Ely will operate, maintain and provide power for the signal.

ON STATE FUNDED PROJECTS:

On State funded projects the bidder is required to hold a valid contractor's license of a class corresponding to the work to be done prior to submitting a bid in accordance with the provisions of NRS Chapter 624.

The bidder's attention is directed to the provisions of NRS 338.147 which is summarized as follows: A responsible bidder who at the time of submitting his bid provides a copy of a certificate of eligibility to receive a preference in bidding on public works, issued to him by the State Contractor's Board, shall be deemed to have submitted a better bid than a competing bidder who has not provided a copy of such a valid certificate of eligibility if the amount of his bid is not more than 5% higher than the amount bid by the competing bidder.

ON FEDERAL AID PROJECTS:

On Federal-aid projects any Contractor, otherwise qualified by the State of Nevada to perform such work, is not required to be licensed nor to submit application for license in advance of submitting a bid or having such bid considered. However, the Contractor determined to be the successful bidder shall obtain the required license in accordance with the provisions of NRS Chapter 624 prior to executing the contract.

The Contractor agrees to ensure that disadvantaged business enterprises as defined in 49 CRF, Part 26 Amended have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of the contracts and subcontracts financed in whole or in part with Federal funds. The requirements for compliance are contained in subsection 102.03 and 103.02 of the Special Provisions and in the contract provisions appended to the Special Provisions.
