Sealed proposals will be received by the Director of the Nevada Department of Transportation, Carson City Headquarters, 1263 South Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, until and opened at **2:00 p.m.**, local time, on **April 20, 2000** for **Contract No. 3017**, Project No. SP-000M(069), for Underground Injection Control (UIC) Phase III, Statewide, Nevada.

SPECIFIC DESCRIPTION OF WORK COVERED BY THIS CONTRACT CONSISTS OF: (1) **CONCRETE WASHPADS WITH WATER CONNECTION, LIGHTS, AND ELECTRICAL SERVICE, AND ALL RELATED PIPING AND TRENCHING;** (2) **CONCRETE SEDIMENT BASIN CONSTRUCTION ADJACENT TO WASHPADS;** (3) **CONCRETE VAULTS AND TANK SYSTEMS FOR SAND AND SAND/OIL INTERCEPTION, INCLUDING SHUT-OFF VALVES, SAMPLE COLLECTION BOXES, AND RELATED PIPING AND TRENCHING;** (4) **FLOOR DRAIN PLUMBING, CLEANING, REPLACING, AND REMOVING, WITHIN EXISTING BUILDINGS;** (5) **PIPING, TRENCHING, CLEAN-OUTS, DISTRIBUTION BOXES, AND MANHOLES TO CONNECT TO MUNICIPAL SEWER OR STORM DRAIN SYSTEMS, STANDARD LEACHFIELDS, OR "INFILTRATOR" LEACHFIELD SYSTEMS, PCC AND AC PAVEMENT, PAVEMENT PATCHING, AND DRAINAGE SWALES;** (6) **CHAINLINK FENCE C O N S T R U C T I O N A N D REMOVAL/REPLACEMENT, AND FARM FENCE CONSTRUCTION AND (7) REPLACEMENT OF 1,000 FALLON ABOVE GROUND HEATING OIL TANK (BEATTY MAINTENANCE STATION ONLY).** The Engineer's estimate on this project for is **\$1,200,000.00.**

**ON STATE FUNDED PROJECTS:**

On State funded projects the bidder is required to hold a valid contractor's license of a class corresponding to the work to be done prior to submitting a bid in accordance with the provisions of NRS Chapter 624.

The bidder's attention is directed to the provisions of NRS 338.147 which is summarized as follows: A responsible bidder who at the time of submitting his bid provides proof of either: (1) payment of at least five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per year of sales and use tax on materials used for construction for each of the five (5) immediate preceding years or: (2) payment of at least five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per year of motor vehicle privilege tax for each of the five (5) immediate preceding years, shall be deemed to have submitted a better bid than a competing bidder who has not paid the taxes if the amount of his bid is not more than five (5) percent higher than the amount bid by the competing bidder.

**ON FEDERAL AID PROJECTS:**

On Federal-aid projects any Contractor, otherwise qualified by the State of Nevada to perform such work, is not required to be licensed nor to submit application for license in advance of submitting a bid or having such bid considered. However, the Contractor determined to be the successful bidder shall obtain the required license in accordance with the provisions of NRS Chapter 624 prior to executing the contract.

The Contractor agrees to ensure that disadvantaged business enterprises as defined in 49 CRF, Part 23 Amended have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of the contracts and subcontracts financed in whole or in part with Federal funds. The requirements for compliance are contained in subsection 102.03 and 103.02 of the Special Provisions and in the contract provisions appended to the Special Provisions.
